

## "A Cube On A Table" Video Carving Tutorial - By Madcarver

Hi there. Thank you for getting this video. Below you will see some notes that you may find helpful.

## **Tools used for this project:**

- Basswood block
- Rubber mat
- Ballpoint tracing Stylus
- Pencil
- Ruler
- Woodcarving Chisels

## **Madcarver Recommends:**

- 1. The wood used is Basswood. Use whatever wood you like, though a wood species that is easy to carve. The size Madcarver used was about 3.5"x6.0"x1.0"
  - a) Use whatever sized wood block you'd like as long as the full pattern fits atop the wood.
- 2. Use of a rubber router mat to arrest movement of the wood stock when you are working on it. You can find this mat on <u>Amazon</u>.
- 3. Use a ballpoint tracing stylus. You can save a lot of money over the years when not buying carbon paper. It can be found here on Amazon.
- 4. Any generic pencil & ruler will do.
- 5. I have partnered with a company that sells Schaaf Chisels. I recommend them, and you can see my reviews of them <a href="here">here</a>. These chisels are top notch and I wish they were around when I was starting out. The best thing is that they are a third of the cost of their competitors and can be purchased from Bear Woods <a href="here">here</a>. The wood carving chisels used in this tutorial were gathered over my many years of wood carving, and I still used a few of the Schaaf chisels in it.
